**PUBLIC SAFETY COMMITTEE MEETING MINUTES
MARCH 16, 2022 - 4:00 P.M.
FIRE RESCUE**

CALL TO ORDER:

A meeting of the City of Clarksville Public Safety Committee was called to order by Chairman Travis Hollman , Wednesday, March 16, 2022, at 4:06pm.

ATTENDANCE:

It was noted by Chairman Hollman that there was a quorum.

Chairman Travis Hollman, Councilperson Wanda Allen, Councilperson Karen Reynolds,

Others Participating: Building & Codes Director David Smith, Fire & Rescue Chief Freddie Montgomery, Chief of Police David Crockarell, Administrative Supervisor Gina Johnson

ADOPTION OF MINUTES:

The committee unanimously approved the minutes from the January 19, 2022 Public Safety Committee Meeting. This was after Chairman Hollman made a motion to approve. It was approved by Councilperson Allen and was properly seconded by Councilperson Reynolds.

FIRE & RESCUE DEPARTMENT:

- Chief Freddie Montgomery spoke on behalf of the Fire & Rescue Department.
 - Chief reviewed the previously submitted monthly report.
 - Chief noted there were 11 Structure Fires with an estimated damage of \$2,961,321.
 - Chief noted there are 8 new sworn in Firefighters on February 25th along with 6 new Promotions.
 - Chief noted the new Burn Building was dedicated in honor of the late Firefighter Tommy Minniehan. (The Bearcat)
 - Chief noted CFR donated 7 sets of old extrication equipment to County Fire.
 - Chief opened the floor for questions.
 - Councilperson Renyolds asked about the overall staffing levels.
 - Chief stated 6 just graduated from the Academy and CFR currently has 9 vacancies. He said the next Academy should be around May 2nd.
 - Councilperson Reynolds asked what was the age limit for retirement.
 - Chief replied age 60.
 - Councilperson Holliman asked what the extrication equipment was.
 - Chief stated it is hydraulic rescue tools (Jaws of Life).
 - Councilperson Holliman asked if there was a special ceremony for the promotions.
 - Chief stated it is held in the training room. Their family is invited to attend the ceremony.

BUILDING & CODES DEPARTMENT:

- David Smith spoke on behalf of Building and Codes.
 - He reviewed the previously submitted monthly report.
 - He noted the payments for the permits would go up due to a Gas & Water Project for \$90,000 dollars.
 - He noted on average 23 to 24 inspections per employee.
 - Mr. Smith opened the floor for questions.
 - Councilperson Reynolds asks about staffing levels.
 - Mr. Smith replied the employees are certified and can take on multiple trades while on site. He will not be asked for additional employees in the upcoming year.
 - Councilperson Reynolds asked what the standard was for single family homes.
 - Mr. Smith went over the 4 different trades for inspection.
 - Councilperson Reynolds asked about the 2018 Fire codes.

- Mr. Smith stated the 2018 Fire Code will be in place for the next 6 years.

POLICE DEPARTMENT:

- Chief David Crockarell spoke on behalf of the Police Department.
 - He reviewed the previously submitted monthly report.
 - He stated with the census results 15 more will need to be hired each year through 2026 to get to officer ratio. The national average per thousand is 2.2
 - He discussed the need for staff and the cost that comes with hiring additional officers.
 - Councilperson Allen asked if there was a retention on how many years a new officer has to stay with the department.
 - Chief Crockarell stated it exists but is not implemented. He stated the retention is better.
 - Councilperson Hollman asked if there was any type of recruitment for local officers living here but working in surrounding counties.
 - Chief Crockarell stated that they do not but if they applied they would look at them.
 - Councilperson Hollman stated he has seen people constantly running traffic lights.
 - Councilperson Reynolds asked who sets the fines for the tickets.
 - Chief Crockarell said that CPD didn't set the fines for the tickets.

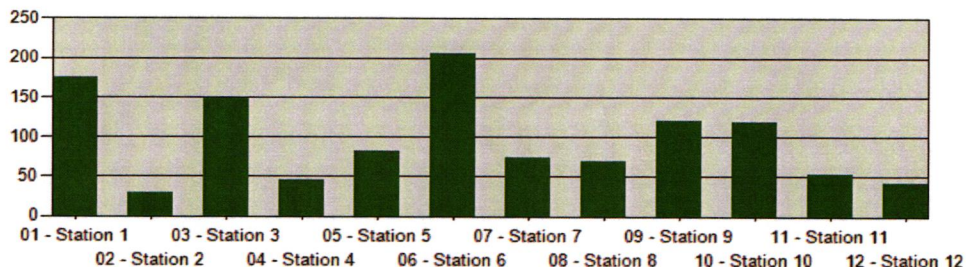

Incidents Per Station For Date and Time Range with End Time Next Day for Station

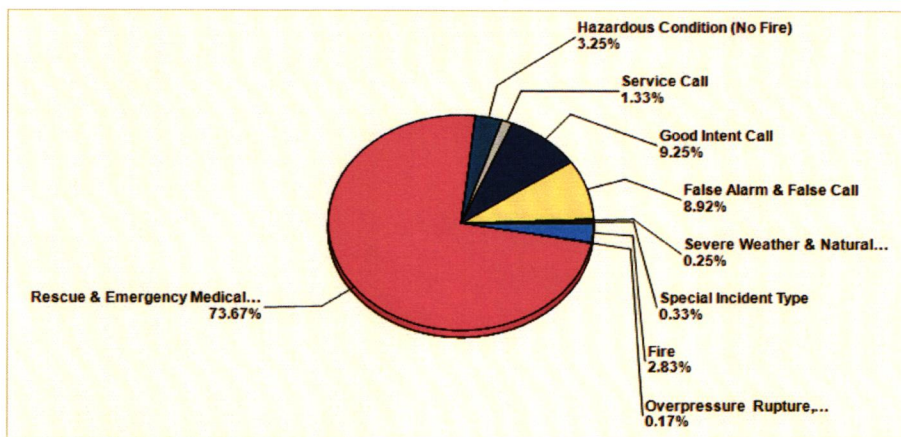

ORDINANCE XX-2022-XX

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING TITLE 2 OF THE OFFICIAL CITY CODE TO DELETE SUB-PARAGRAPH (3) UNDER SECTION 2-108 AND DELETE SUB-PARAGRAPHS (2) and (3) UNDER SECTION 2-208.

WHEREAS, for the purpose of complying with legal requirements and to expand business opportunities to the residents of the City of Clarksville, the City Council finds it to be in the best interest of the City to delete certain provisions of Title 2 of the City Code pertaining to the storage, sale, distribution, or manufacture of beer and alcoholic beverages.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CLARKSVILLE:

- (1) The Clarksville City Code, Title 2 (Alcoholic Beverages) Section 2-108 is hereby amended by deleting the language contained in sub-paragraph (3) and substituting in its place the word "Reserved".
